

Frequently Asked Questions

What should I budget for my residency?

Every project is unique, but artists should budget for:

- Studio fee (minimum)
- Materials -\$100 - \$600, depending on scope of project – see [Materials costs](#)
- Housing (typically around \$300/week, depending on availability and accommodations)
- Travel
- Meals
- Any requested technical assistance beyond basic orientation

After acceptance, we'll work with you to prepare a project estimate before confirming your residency.

[Studio fees](#) begin at our current weekly studio rental rate and increase depending on project scope, materials, and technical support.

Will I have my own studio?

No, you will not have a private studio. You will have dedicated workspace and storage for materials and works in progress, as well as access to Morgan equipment and facilities following required training.

Do I have to use Morgan paper?

No. Artists are welcome to bring their own papers and materials when appropriate. Morgan staff can also recommend or produce papers specifically for your project.

Can the Morgan make paper for my project?

Custom paper production may be available for an additional fee depending on staff availability and project scope.

Will Morgan staff help me make my work?

Staff provide orientation, equipment training, and technical guidance. Production assistance may be available for certain processes by prior arrangement. Artists remain responsible for creating their own work.

Can I work independently?

Yes. After required safety training, resident artists receive seven-days-a-week access to approved studios and equipment.
